

PHL Week 17 Recap

September 1, 2026

One Week Left, and Almost Everything Is Still in Play

Week 17 pushed the 2026 Pegasus Horseshoe League season into its final three games with major movement in both the team standings and individual award races. Two players reached 50 points, the Scoring Championship tightened to a seven-point margin, the ringer lead changed hands again, and the Hercules Conference race was cut to a single game. Around the pits, the late-season races continued to be a regular topic of conversation, with players checking the updated numbers and comparing where they stood as the final week approached.

Not Fast, Just Furious Clinches the Top Seed

Not Fast, Just Furious delivered one of the week's most important team results, sweeping Orbital Bombardment 3-0 and improving to **35-16**. The sweep officially clinched the **Orion Conference Championship, Best Regular Season Record and the No. 1 overall playoff seed**.

Keep Their Heads Ringin' can still mathematically reach 35 wins, but Not Fast, Just Furious already owns the season head-to-head tiebreaker between the teams, **4-2**. That guarantees NFast the top position regardless of what happens in Week 18. Todd Andrews powered the sweep with **50 points, 15 ringers and a double**, while Ed MacNeil added 22 points.

Hercules Comes Down to the Final Week

While the overall No. 1 seed is settled, the **Hercules Conference** is anything but. Whole Lotta Pitches took two of three from Keep Their Heads Ringin' in Week 17, cutting the conference lead to only one game. KTHR enters the finale at **32-19**, with Whole Lotta Pitches immediately behind at **31-20**.

Casey Santos led WLP with **50 points and 12 ringers**, while Jake Duperre added 26. Josh Carroll was the standout for KTHR with 31 points and an eye-catching **22 singles**. With three games remaining, Hercules will be decided in the final week.

Scoring, Ringers and Doubles All Tighten

The individual award races may be even tighter. **Sean Gomes** entered Week 17 holding a 15-point advantage over Casey Santos in the Scoring Championship race. Gomes still produced a strong **42-point, 11-ringer** night, but Santos' 50-point performance cut the season margin to only **seven points, 685-678**. Gomes leads at **13.43 PPG**, with Santos at **13.29** heading into the final three games.

The ringer lead changed hands for the second consecutive week. Santos had moved one ahead of Todd Andrews in Week 16, but Andrews' 15 ringers in Week 17 pushed him back to the top with **178**, just two ahead of Santos' **176**. Gomes remains third with 163.

Andrews also strengthened his position in doubles. His Week 17 double moved him into sole possession of first with **11**, one ahead of Gomes at 10. Devin Santos sits at nine and Casey Santos at eight, leaving another major award race still open entering the finale.

Carroll Makes a Statement in the Singles Race

Josh Carroll's 22-single performance was one of the more unusual statistical lines of the night and further strengthened his lead in the Singles Championship race. Carroll now has **243 singles in 48 games for 5.06 SPG**. Ed MacNeil has actually recorded one more total single - 244 - but has played three more games and sits second at **4.78 SPG**.

The Best B Player race remains led by **Keith DeBurgo at 9.90 PPG**, followed by Carroll at 9.38 and MacNeil at 9.20. DeBurgo finished Week 17 with 23 points and a double despite Precious Cargo's difficult night.

Tom Wolfe Returns as Dark Horse Rolls

After Wayne Gomes completed his three-week substitute stint, **Tom Wolfe returned** to Steel the Point and immediately posted **36 points, 10 ringers and a double**. Wolfe now has 42 games played, moving him beyond the league's 75-percent eligibility requirement for the major individual awards.

Elsewhere, Dark Horse produced the week's other sweep, going **3-0 against Precious Cargo**. Devin Santos led the way with **42 points, 10 ringers and a double**, while Willie Coats added 20. The sweep moved Dark Horse to 22-29 and included the only team shutout of Week 17.

The Final Week Has Plenty Left to Decide

Week 18 arrives with the No. 1 overall seed secured but very little else settled. Keep Their Heads Ringin' and Whole Lotta Pitches are separated by one game in Hercules. Sean Gomes and Casey Santos are separated by seven points in scoring. Todd Andrews and Santos are separated by two ringers, while Andrews and Gomes are one double apart.

There are milestones within reach as well. **Devin Santos and Willie Coats are each four points away** from 2,000 and 1,000 career points respectively, while **Casey Santos is 16 points from 8,000**. With championships, awards and milestones all converging on the same night, the 2026 regular season is set up for a fitting finish.
